We are thrilled to present an incredible and diverse line-up of performances, programs and workshops in our *Your* RPAC Program Guide August – December 2022.



BY A THREAD

One Fell Swoop Circus

Seven acrobats and 30 metres of rope...

Long spools of white rope run through pulley sheaves and wrap around bodies, explicitly connecting the artists' movements above and off the ground. Like the booms and sheets of a sailing ship, the performers are hoisted and swung by one another to create striking tableaux and breathtaking dynamics. The actions of one acrobat affect and implicate the movements of others in a mesmerising negotiation of cause and effect.

By a Thread weaves virtuosic acrobatics and intricate choreography through moments of confusion, hilarity, romance, playfulness, fear and friendship, uncovering the threads of connection present in all relationships. More than mere bodies in space, By a Thread is an exploration of tensions physical, emotional and relational.

SILENCE pulls the Treaty conversation out from under the rug, slams it back on the table and invites you to make it a talking point!

SILENCE is about the space in between. The conversations not being heard and the responses that are muted. Through the beating of a drum, bodies thrash through frequencies to uncover what lies in the SILENCE.

There's SILENCE between the stars as the Emu travels across the night sky. There's SILENCE in the dancers' energy when they hit the Cut – the rupture between rhythms and movement where the spirit world can enter. It's also the deafening SILENCE under white noise. The same questions echoed through generations.

We have marched across Country. We have had promises made and promises broken. The conversation about a TREATY will never be silenced.

ARTIST INTERVIEW



Thomas E.S. Kelly Co-Artistic Director Karul Projects

Karul Projects will bring their bold and uncompromising production SILENCE to the RPAC stage on Friday 14 October (see previous page). Ahead of this performance, we took the opportunity to talk to Co-Artistic Director Thomas E.S. Kelly about his motivation to create this work and his journey within the Arts industry.

This show is just brimming with energy, ideas, humour and heart - what drew you to create the work?

I spent four years creating this work because I wanted to add to the political conversation in Australia, to add Karul's voice to an ongoing call for Treaty. Conversations that have been had for 20, 30, 40 years. So, SILENCE is still just as relevant today as it was when the first ships arrived 252 years ago. We still don't have an agreement with the government and we're still the only Commonwealth country that has never had one.

Karul Projects has been around since 2017, how did the company start?

I started Karul because as a First Nations artist, I didn't see many companies telling the stories of my people, there weren't enough Blak companies telling Blak stories. When Taree and I left NAISDA, we performed with many different companies but there wasn't an opportunity with other Blak dance artists so we made our own. As well as bringing up other young ones to not only perform, but also make their own work or their own companies.

You've worked on some incredible projects since graduating from NAISDA Dance College in 2012 - can you tell us about [MIS]CONCIEVE, for which you won a Green Room Award in 2016?

This is the work that kicked it all off for us. Where I got the thirst for choreography, making work and storytelling on stage. As much as the work is about public misconceptions, it is also a personal story. As an artist, it's exciting to make work and it be presented. This is the trajectory that propelled me to start making more work.

You draw on so many art forms aside from straight dance - film, music, theatre - and so much great work has been made in the last few years. Who and what are some of the key creatives and works that standout for you recently?

Vicki Van Hout is someone who always continues to inspire me, through both conversation and performance. Vicki and Taree Sansbury are both responsible for leading me to where I am today.

From afar, being in the industry, I admire Stephanie Lake, The Farm and Dancenorth's work, along with the plethora of First Nations creatives including Dan Riley, Dalisa Pigram, Francis Rings, Jacob Boehme, Joel Bray, Gina Rings and many more. Recently, there has been a massive shift with funding and a shift in leadership amongst us. The young groups and independents starting to come up is also incredibly inspiring.



Jess was a featured artist in Paul Kelly's set, leading to the release of the track they sang together, *Everyday My Mother's Voice*, and their collaboration on Channel 9 and Frontier Touring's *Music From The Home Front* (MFTHF). Jess was part of MFTHF in 2021, singing a duet version of *'Sorrento Moon'* alongside Tina Arena.

SACHÉM

The Bigger Picture

Following on from his huge debut EP Part of the Picture, Aboriginal and African-American artist Sachém Parkin-Owens returns with The Bigger Picture and an east-coast tour, kicking off with a hybrid performance at RPAC.

Anchored in music and spoken word poetry, the new work highlights Sachém's award-winning contemporary sound, weaving in theatrical elements of dance, visual projection and film.

Since the release of his EP in 2021, the rapper, singer, and poet has travelled Australia and the world, developing this new body of work that explores and dissects the reasons, motivations and stories behind *Part of the Picture*. *The Bigger Picture* is the second chapter: a hard-hitting, self-empowered theatre show that celebrates First Nations lives and dives deep into stories of disconnection and reconnection.

A frontline leader and a voice for the people, Sachém grew up between Adelaide and Minjerribah (North Stradbroke Island), and laces rhymes with personal stories, while touching on poignant social and cultural issues that have and continue to impact his life.

ARTIST INTERVIEW



SACHÉM PARKIN-OWENS

Rapper, singer and spoken-word poet

Sachém will premiere his *The Bigger Picture* tour at RPAC on Friday 28 October (see opposite page). Ahead of this performance, we took the opportunity to find out more about his inspirations and motivations. For the full interview, visit the Artist Features section on the RPAC website.

You have made a name for yourself with your versatile catalogue of music and energetic live show. What does your name represent both in terms of your music and the cultures you're representing?

The direct translation of my name means 'Silent Warrior'. Sachém is the title given to the chief of the Mohegan tribes of North East America. How the name relates to me directly is still being revealed, I know I have a passion for change and a desire to help people. So far, I believe my music is the reason I've been able to do that for people around me

You are a big believer in spoken word poetry and hip hop, and the important role they can play within the wider community. Can you talk a bit about this in terms of your work and its origins?

Yes, I am a big believer in poetry and hip hop being crucial to the progression of communities and cultures. It has created a platform for people within minority and colonised communities to speak the truth. This has now evolved and is one of, if not the most powerful art form used to bring about social and political conversation and change. These conversations and changes inspire people from communities, like mine, to feel comfortable with the idea of self-expression and self-acceptance. I am another example of a Black Person of Colour who has been freed through the art of poetry and the culture of hip hop.

Has there been a pivotal artist or album that was a catalyst moment for your work? Who has been your biggest inspiration?

There have been many inspirations over the years. Lyrically, people like Biggie Smalls, Common, Bob Marley, A Tribe Called Quest, and J. Cole have driven me to uncover deeper parts of myself through writing. Musically, bands like Dire Straits, Eagles, Cat Stevens, J. Dilla and Pete Rock have all contributed to the inspiration of my sound. You will find that a lot of my music is a straight blend between real instruments and production, where needed.

What are you most looking forward to about the creation of a production like this?

The most exciting part about creating a production like this is having the tools, space and belief from community to take a project on like this. I'm looking forward to continuing my journey of self-expression and being able to do it on country with friends and family.

ARTIST INTERVIEW

JONATHON WELCH Founding Artistic Director, Play It Forward Aust Ltd

Jonathon Welch recently moved to Redlands Coast and we are excited to welcome him to RPAC for a number of projects this year, including *Redlands Sings!* (see opposite page). Check out what he has to say about the project in this interview below.

We're excited that you're now considered a Redlands Coast local. What made you decide to relocate to this neck of the woods?

I lived in Brisbane in the '80s when I was studying at Queensland Conservatorium and performing with Lyric Opera of Queensland at QPAC back when it first opened. I always dreamt of returning one day and I knew Redlands would be the perfect location, with its beautiful coastal breezes and scenery, relaxed lifestyle, easy access to the airport and city, the most wonderful cultural centre in RPAC and an amazing creative community.

You've had such a marvellously full and rewarding career, how would you best describe your experience with music and singing over the years?

I have been very blessed to have an incredibly diverse career in the music industry and so many amazing opportunities for over four decades now, and every experience has been unique and totally rewarding in its own way. For me, music and singing is how I've been able to make sense of the world – it's how I feel that I can make a valuable contribution and in return, feel valued. I still wake up every day feeling excited about the opportunities I have to be involved in the creative process of making music and sharing my joy of singing.

What are the most fulfilling aspects of your work with Play It Forward?

Play It Forward has been all about creating as many opportunities to involve as many people in our inclusive arts projects, programs and events. Our mission has been to bridge the gap between the professional music and community arts sectors, collaborating with government, the private sector, education, welfare and health organisations. It's so exciting to see what can be achieved when we all work together and bring our strengths to help deliver high quality music and arts programs alongside highly skilled practitioners that everyone can learn from. I just love seeing everyone having musical experiences and doing things they thought they could never or would ever do!

Redland Sings! isn't quite Pub Choir but it's close. What is it about community singing that people get excited about?

Redland Sings! is all about access and inclusion and involving people of all ages and abilities to come and have fun singing, not just adults. We humans love to feel we are part of a 'team' and Redland Sings! is going to create a new 'musical family' in our 'music village' at RPAC – where everyone, young and old, can come and just have fun being 'in the moment' for an hour and sing!

Among your classical selections, what are some of your favourite songs from other genres? Can you give us a slice of what's to come for *Redland Sings!*

I have very eclectic musical tastes, and love everything from music theatre to pop, rock, gospel, country music and beyond. We won't be doing any classical repertoire, so you'll just have to come along and be surprised. Every session is going to be totally different!
